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In the Georgian period, there were many ways to share information such as journals and pamphlets. In role as editors, can you find the fascinating examples located around the house (e.g. books from Bath's Circulating Library) and list them in your own historical journal using a quill, ink and sealing wax.

Students will:

- Examine evidence to understand Georgian methods of communication
- Handle original artefacts including a writing box and seal fob
- Wear replica costumes (KS2 & 3)
- Explore the house to identify 18th century objects which would have been used by Mr Sandford, resident of No.1, to find out about the world about him.
