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Henry Sandford lived at No.1 for 20 years until his death in 1796. Using a range of historical items such as a leech jar plus accounts of 18th century medical conditions, can you identify and record some possible causes of his death?

Students will:

- Examine evidence to understand the life and times of an historical character.
- Handle original artefacts
- Wear replica costumes (KS2 & 3)
- Explore the house to identify 18th century objects which could have helped or hindered Mr Sandford's health.
